VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Are you ready for Election Day? Get all the information you need to register to vote, how to vote, and more below.

When is Election Day?

Election day is
Tue, Nov 5, 2024.

Where do I vote?

Voting in Weber County is done by mail or by using one of the ballot drop boxes located throughout the county.

How do I register to vote?

You can pick up a voter registration form at any Weber County Library location

Fill out the registration form and turn it in at any Weber County Library location or you may take it to the Weber County Clerk/Auditor Office at:

Ogden, Utah 84401**

How secure is vote by mail and the ballot drop boxes? What happens to my ballot once I turn it in?

Voting by mail or using the ballot drop boxes is kept secure through the efforts of the Weber County Elections Office. For detailed information, visit the Ballot Processing page of the Weber Elections website at weberelections.gov

When is the voter registration deadline?

To vote in the November general election, all voter registrations must be received by the Weber County Clerk/Auditor's office by 5:00 p.m. on Fri, Oct 25, 2024.

Who can register to vote?

You can register to vote if you are:

- A citizen of the United States.
- A Utah resident for at least 30 days prior to Election Day.
- At least 18 years of age on or before the day of the General Election (Teens aged 16 and 17 may pre-register to vote and will be automatically sent a ballot when they officially become eligible to vote).
- Residing at the address where you are registering.

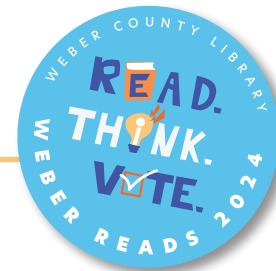

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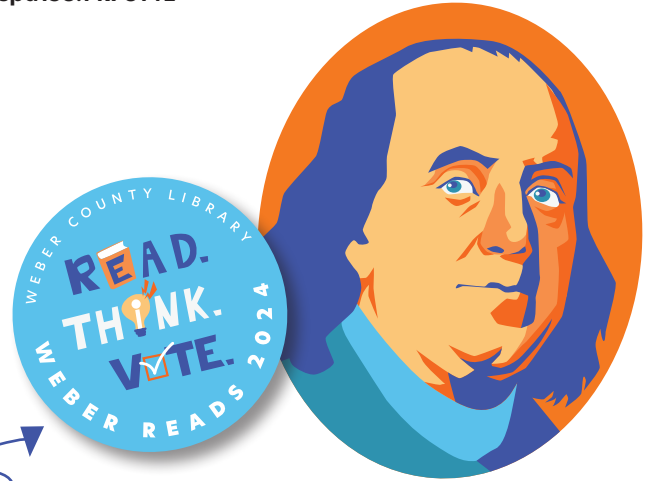

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The annual Weber Reads program provides opportunities for community-wide reading, reflecting, and engagement, across the lines of age, culture, and life circumstance. Each year, texts or themes are selected that help illuminate experiences and beliefs while transcending group values to unite us as human beings. The American Library Association has three times chosen Weber Reads to receive its Community Reading Program "Best of Show" award. Weber Reads is funded in part by a generous donation from the Ralph Nye Charitable Foundation.

ABOUT THE 2024 THEME

As election season begins, the pressure mounts for citizens to sort through candidates and hot-button issues to determine which direction their votes will go. As a library system, we encourage open, civil discussions on voting, informed citizenship, and civic engagement and reflect on our shared history, both as a state and a country. We invite all to participate in book discussions, film screenings, and interactive programs and presentations that will thoughtfully explore the role each of us plays in our democratic society.
